I go into an empty building or an open field looking for the kittens that I can hear crying for help. I can hear them, but I can't find them. When I sleep, I dream of them. "


So, we pull out all of the stops to find them. We bring in the man with the chainsaw to cut down the wall or ceiling. An army of volunteers to walk carefully, and listen closely for their cries, sometimes setting humane traps for them.

We cannot save them all, but we have saved a lot of them. We have many more resources now than when we started cat rescue. We use all of the resources at our disposal and we partner with other cat rescues and organizations in the community to perform miracles...on a shoestring.

Angel Ridge animal Rescue was started in 2000, caring for rescue dogs and horses. Barb Brown and her husband, John, were dedicated dog walking volunteers. They began to notice another species in dire need of rescue and care. They started taking care of the feral cats that had taken up residence on the Angel Ridge farm property.

What is now the cat program of Angel Ridge Animal Rescue, began with the feeding and trapping of 40 cats on the property, and the half empty hayloft became the shelter for many of them. From there, an empty horse stall was converted into "kitty digs", and was equipped with a fan in the summer, and a plug-in heater in the winter. Every cat had enough food, a soft bed and music played softly on the radio for them.

Somewhere around 2013, I was persuaded that our cats really needed better creature comforts, and we moved our cat operation into the backroom of our donated construction trailer that served as our business office. We were "paw to elbow ", so to speak for two years, sharing the limited space. Two years later in 2015, the two-story caretaker apartment in the horse barn became vacant. Bailey's Cat Haven and the beginning of our expanded cat rescue department had begun.

Gathering of Guardian Angels ~7 This past spring, the cat volunteers were asked to assist in the rescue of cats and kittens from a Section 8 housing complex in the South Hills area of Pittsburgh. Some of the cats and kittens were hiding in a garage, with a roof ready to collapse onto them. Last year, a Washington County trailer park begged us for our help. We were given space in an empty trailer to shelter the cats rescued there, until they could receive veterinary care. So, in addition to the volunteers providing cat care at Baileys at Angel Ridge Animal Rescue, we had to recruit other volunteers to provide the same care at this second location. An ongoing rescue situation began this spring and summer of what we believe to be dozens of cats and kittens left behind, when the owner of a home died unexpectedly in Scenery Hill, Washington County. Barb Brown tells us: "These kittens were rescued from the Scenery Hill house and we are looking for others. They were found in the attic between the insulation and the roof. We had to pull them out. We could hear them crying. We believe that the mother cat could not reach them to feed them, as they had fallen down very far. They are undernourished for their age. I am currently syringe feeding them in my home."

On some occasions we find a mother cat who is nursing her litter, and we rescue them all, but it doesn't always work out that way. Many times, we only find the very young kittens and there is no mother around. These litters need to be bottle fed if they are to survive. Consider the skill, time, and dedication of the cat care volunteers to help these kittens survive.

This "army" of special kitten care people are our fosters. Without them, most of the abandoned kittens that we find would not survive. At this writing, the Angel Ridge Animal Rescue program has 24 foster families caring for 78 kittens and 14 adult cats. There are approximately 25 other adult cats that are sheltered at Bailey's. There are currently 49 cat care volunteers.

Barb has also partnered with the businesses and groups that we need to do this lifesaving work. Veterinary and spay and neuter services are provided by Fix UR Cat in Canonsburg, at discounted prices. Angel Ridge Animal Rescue and Fix UR Cat have worked closely with one another for several years on cat rescue and fund raising. Both groups have prospered greatly through this collaboration.

Pet Supplies Plus, in McMurray, has allowed us to keep some cats and kittens in cages in their store, and they are all adopted quickly. Petco, in Washington, and Pet Supplies Plus have allowed us to do offsite adoptions out of their stores and have generously donated food and supplies for our cats. Petco Love, Petco's charitable foundation, has been generous to Angel Ridge Animal Rescue with financial grants throughout the years. Last year we were able to adopt 242 cats and kittens to wonderful homes. We have saved the lives of thousands of cats and kittens, and often times, we were the only cat rescue organization that answered our communities' call for help. The catalyst for all of these cat and kitten rescues is our Cat Care Coordinator, Barb Brown. She is a quiet, but effective leader who is driven to save as many cats and kittens as she can. In her words, "It haunts me.... once I see a situation, I cannot walk away."

This is probably the mantra of many dedicated animal rescuers. It is Barb's mantra and it is my mantra. So we continue on, sometimes on a" wing and a prayer", but always working on the miracles that we can make happen to save precious lives every day.



From Death's Doorstep to Livin' Like a Rock Star

...the story of Duddie

He had the hardest of lives... living on the streets where only a very few survive. He begged for food and affection. He looked after the weaker ones within his colony. But Duddie found himself on death's doorstep, not once, but twice. First when he was intentionally poisoned, and survived, and then to have his throat slit open.

Angel Ridge cat volunteer, Kelly Smith, rescued Duddie and cared for him until he was well enough to come to Angel Ridge Animal Rescue. Duddie's throat injury meant that he could only eat wet food. He was also diagnosed as FIV positive, a condition also called feline AIDS.

In the fall of 2019, Elise Mowrey, a volunteer who came to be known as Duddie's fairy godmother, took a liking to Duddie very quickly. In fact, Duddie had stolen her heart. But Duddie also had an extra special place in the hearts of all of the Angel Ridge Animal Rescue cat volunteers because of the horrible trauma that he had endured throughout his short life. He instantly bonded with another FIV positive cat, Cheshire, and they became best friends. They touched paws through their cages and enjoyed roaming outside their cages, running around and playing. Duddie's story touched the hearts of everyone who came to visit the shelter. Unfortunately, he was often overlooked by potential adopters because of the special needs he would require, being FIV positive and on the restricted wet food only diet.


Elise told me, "I counted down the minutes until I graduated and had my own pet friendly apartment so I could adopt Duddie. I told my friends and family that if Duddie did not have a home by the time I graduated, I could adopt him and I would take him home with me. Exactly one year after he came to the shelter, Duddie came home with me to his forever home. That was October 11th, 2021."

Duddie quickly adapted to his new luxurious life, and is a very pampered kitty who lives large in the Lawrenceville neighborhood of Pittsburgh. Even though he lived outside for a long time, he never attempts to leave his comfy "pad". Rock star Duddie is far too comfortable on his favorite chaise lounge while basking in the sun, or lying on his heated blanket. He enjoys his broth treats, playing with all of his new toys, and watching TV all day long. He is a big fan of the television show "Real Housewives." Duddie likes to sit next to his dad while he works from home. Elise tells us, "Duddie can't get enough attention and struts his Rockstar stuff whenever we have visitors. It is hard to believe that he ever lived such a harsh life outside. It is also hard to imagine a time when we didn't have Duddie in our lives."

Seeking Sweet Lullabies for Lola

Lola came to us shortly before Easter. A Humane Police Officer found her wandering aimlessly at a campground in the Laurel Highlands. What made this cruel abandonment even worse is the fact that Lola is totally blind, unable to fend for herself. This sweet, probably 5 year old Sharpei, had some other physical issues. She tested positive for Lyme disease and had a bad skin and urinary tract infection. Lola was taken into the home of Val, our kennel supervisor, which is located on the Angel Ridge property Our volunteers soon learned that Lola's other senses were amazing. On her daily walks down our lane, she could not see the horses in the fields on the side of her, but she could sense them and would pull her walkers over to the fence to be closer to them. On June 2nd, Lola had an enucleation (removal) of both eyes at the specialty vet, PVSEC. The glaucoma in one eye, and entropia in the other eye, were painful conditions that medicines could barely alleviate. Lola was returned to Val's home for a post- op recovery.

Lola's surgery and related vet appointments cost several thousand dollars. We have been raising money, but we still have a shortfall of funds. Can you help us please? Any monies we receive in excess of Lola's bill will be used for other emergency surgeries. Lola is also ready for a loving home. We found that Lola is defensive around other dogs that come into her space, so she must be the only dog in the home. Lola is great with people,

cats, and children. She loves to sit close to you while you rub her belly and back.


