**Kirby was so frightened, and his long hair was matted and dirty.**

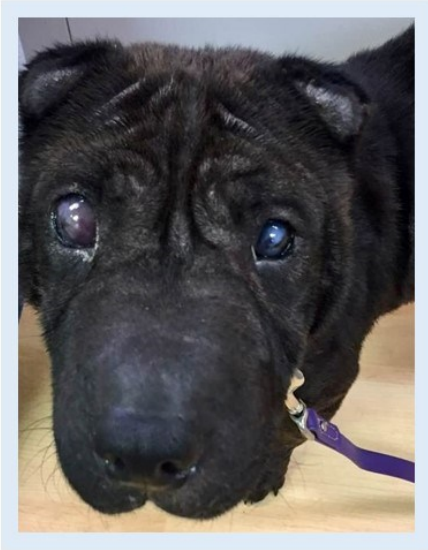
